

Masthead

Description of Component

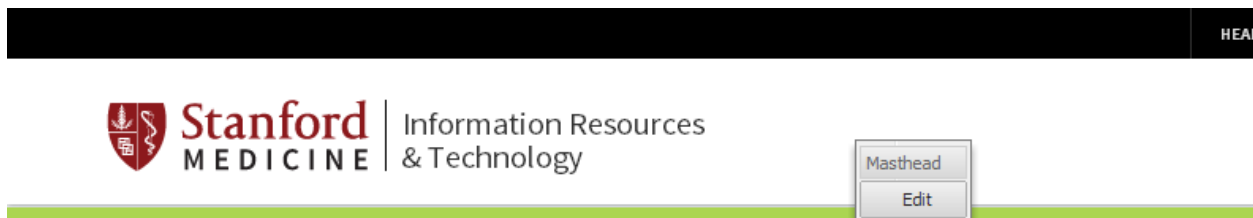
The Masthead component is used to personalize a site with a specific site name for a department, division, lab, or other entity. It can also be used to inherit a site name for child pages of a site if standardization is required. Web authors can also create custom tag lines and add social links specific to their organizations.

How to Use the Component


1. You can identify the Masthead as follows:



2. Right click in the area to bring up the edit feature.





3. This brings up the edit dialog.




4. Enter in the Site Name if it is not being inherited from the parent site.
5. Enter a Site Secondary Name if applicable. An example would be IRT is the department and the site name, while Web Services would be the site secondary name.
6. Uncheck Inherit so that the changes made can be saved.
7. The Site URL can be left blank. By default it links to the parent site.

8. Leave the Inherit box checked to inherit the Site URL.
9. Click the Right Side tab.

10. Enter a Site Tag Line to display on the right side area of the masthead.
11. Uncheck the Inherit box to save your changes.
12. If you have Social Links such as a Facebook page, Twitter account, or LinkedIn, you can add these to the site. Click the down arrow below to select the link. Add the URL in the correct format.



13. Add additional links and order items or delete.

14. For inherit, uncheck the box if you have added Social links. Otherwise, for newly created child pages of the site, the Inherit check box should be checked and then the social links are managed by the parent.
15. Click OK to save all the changes.
